SCOTSMAN Robert Fitzsimmons defended his title but it was close, after a race long battle with runner-up **Richard Hollingsworth**, *Pete Mulholland reports.*

With no more than a stride separating them throughout, and some close calls due to ankle clipping, Fitzsimmons and Hollingsworth exchanged places when touring the park for three circuits.

Hitting the bandstand straight, Fitzsimmons struck and showing the speed that has earned a PB 1500m of 3:42, held off Hollingsworth, to come home just a couple of metres clear.

A member of Kilbarchan AC, Fitzsimmons has placed third in both the 1500m and 3000m in the AAA indoor championships but his immediate aim is to assist his team in an effort to improve on their 12th place in the national 12-stage road relays.

After placing third last year, **Belinda Davies** led from the off and gradually pulled away from **Sue Carris** on each lap for her first win in this event.

Admitting to, "Being happier over the country," Davies was surprised to win, "especially after a recent chest infection."

WHILE Sandra Andreou maintained a clear lead throughout to come home an easy winner Angela Allen and Stephanie Robson matched strides for much of the race prior to the former pulling away in the final stages. *Pete Mulholland reports.*

It was early last year that Andreou returned to athletics after an absence of some 18 years, having previously won championships galore as a 'wonderkind' of her day, and soon showed her class when recording 2:10.9 as a 38-year-old

"I've only just got over shin splints which was the first time I've been injured," said Andreou, "and for my first ever 10k I was pleased with my run today."

According to Athletics Weekly's statistician Ian Hodge, Andreou's (nee Arthurton) best ever performance was indoors. "Personally her greatest run was her victory over 1500m against East Germany at Cosford in 1980 when still only 17," he said.

The men's race saw Shane Snow, who has a best of 29:39 dating back to 1993, go clear over the fourth and final lap to lead home Steve Robinson and David Williams.

Not just a face at the top, the recently appointed Head of the Civil Service Sir Andrew Turnbull, rightly wearing number one, finished 266th from the record 317 finishers. There is no truth in the rumour that those behind him were considering their job security!
