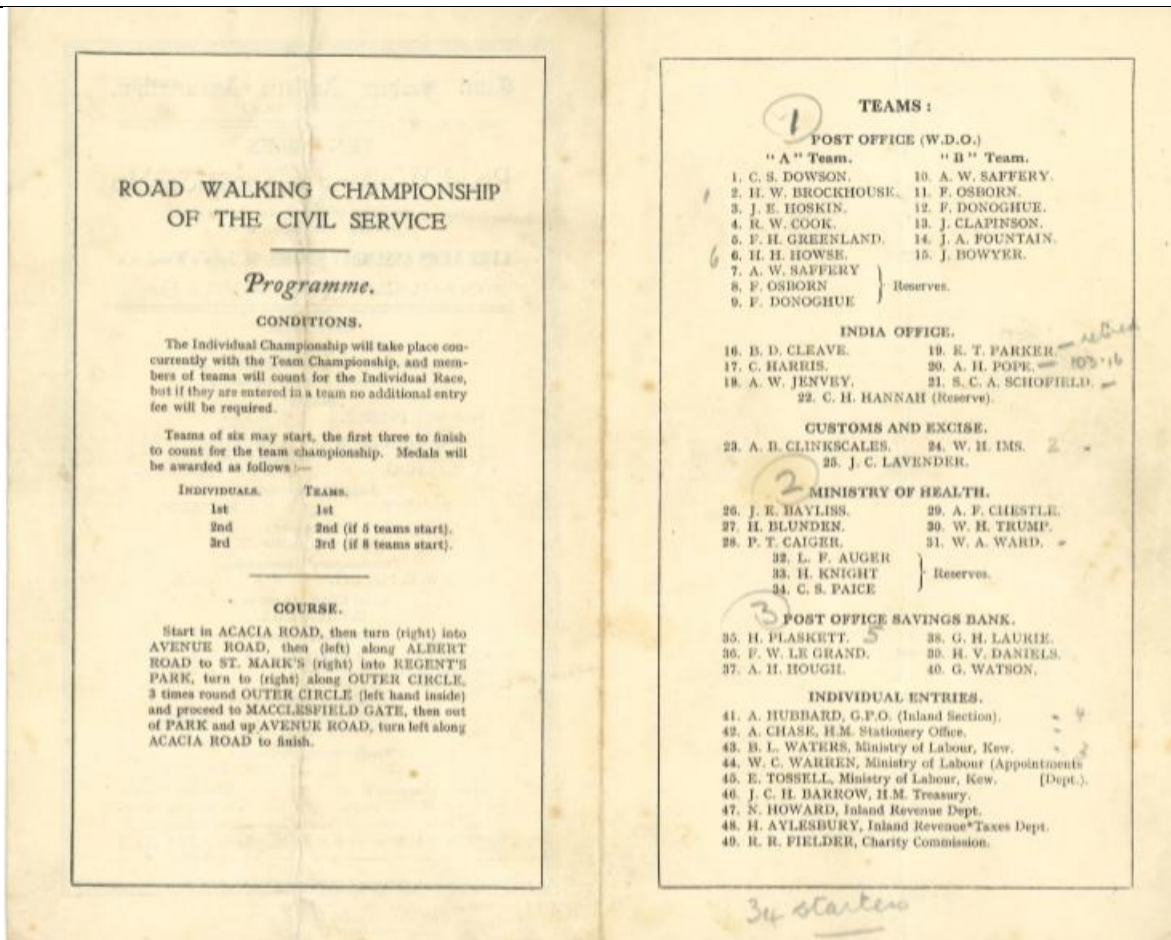

His time for the accurately measured ten miles, consisting mainly of circuits of Regent's Park, was quite convincing. Before the war, Brockhouse, who is hon. secretary of the National **Road Walking** Association, was thought to be a prospective champion.

CIVIL SERVICE WALK

W.D.O. RETAIN THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

C. S. DOWSON FIRST HOME.

There was a wonderfully fine entry for the second annual Civil Service Ten-mile Walking Championship held from the headquarters of the Pease Boxing Club, the Eyre Arms Assembly Rooms, St. John's Wood, on Saturday. With six aside to walk and three to count for team placings, there was an entry of 13 teams and six individuals, one of the individuals, F. Ho.t. of the Yorkshire W.C., who finished 15th in the National Road Walking Championship last week, making the journey from Bradford to compete, but the night travel was a big handicap, and though he walked pluckily he could get no nearer than 6th.

The course was from Acacia-rd into Avenue-rd, along Albert-rd to St Mark's in o Regent's Park, along Outer Circle, three times round Outer Circle to north gate, then out of park and up Avenue-rd, and along Acacia-rd to finish.

The race for individual honours proved a triumph for C S Dowson, the winner of the A.A.A. Two and Seven-mile Championships in 1920, for, after a spell of comparative inactivity, he came out of his shell again, and, walking faultlessly, headed the field practically throughout, winning by nearly three minutes from A E Greening in the fast time of 83min 59sec, over five minutes faster than the time returned by last year's winner, H W Brockhouse, over the same course, viz., 88min 19sec. S C A Schofield, who finished 9th in the National Championship, was evidently feeling the effects of last week's race, as he could get no nearer than 8th, over seven minutes behind the winner.

THE TEAM RACE.

The Post Office (W.D.O.) retained team honours with the greatest of ease, getting their scoring three in the first six placings with a total of 10 points. The Ministry of Health, second last year, were again runners up, but could not press the winners as closely as they did on the previous occasion.

THE RACE DESCRIBED.

At the breakaway Dowson went in front, and at a mile the leaders were Dowson, Cook, Hoskins, Greening, Eden, and Brockhouse. At 2½ miles the first trio were still practically abreast, 50 yards in front of Greening, with Peacock another 120 yards behind. At the half-distance the order and times of the leaders were: Dowson (41min 49sec), Hoskins (42min 19sec), Peacock and Cook (43min 28sec).

At about 7 miles Dowson had opened up a gap of about 300 yards from Hoskins, who fell out at this point, as also did Cook, leaving Peacock in second place. Greening came along finely over the last stretch, beating Peacock out of second place in the last mile, but he could never overhaul the leader, who won as he pleased, and almost as fresh as he started. Daily Herald - Friday 24 April 1925 Pre-Race Build-up Report

For the fourth walking contest, to be decided over ten miles at Regent's Park to-morrow afternoon, the entry of 12 teams has been received, the Ministry of Health nominating two contingents, and over 80 walkers are down to compete.

The men will line up at the Eyre Arms Assembly Rooms, St. John's Wood, and will be sent on their way by Sir Herbert J. Creedy, K.C.B., Secretary of the War Office, at 3 p.m.

THE ROUTE

The route will be by way of Acacia-road and Avenue-road to the Outer Circle of Regent's Park. Three circuits of the latter, which provides going almost skin to track, will be covered, and thence back, through North Gate to the starting point.

As on the occasion of last year's contest, when the Western District Post Office retained the title they have held continuously, by only a single point from the India Office, a close race is anticipated. Keen racing for the individual title is also expected.

Last year, over the same course, A. E. Greening, of the Industrial Research Department, Greenwich, secured the honour, beating the Woodford Green A.C. man, A. H. Pope, of the India Office, after a magnificent tussle, by about 120 yards, in 87min. 47sec.

A few weeks ago Greening won the 10 miles Essex County Championship in 80min. 17sec., and in the A.A.A. seven miles track championship, on April 4, finished fifth in 56min. 5sec.

Pope, and also A. E. Sims, of the Inland Revenue, who was third last year, are expected to improve on their performance of a year ago.

The record for the course is 83min. 59sec., made by the A.A.A. ex-champion, C. S. Dowson, when representing the Western District P.O. in 1923. Greening, I fancy, will retain his title, but I should not be greatly surprised to see the Western District postmen dispossessed of the team honours by the India Office.

Among other well-known heel-and-toe exponents who will be competing, and who will doubtless figure prominently in the race, are: P. T. Cuiger (Ministry of Health), J. E. Hoskins (Western District P.O.), C. O. Peacock (Northern District P.O.), B. C. Brown (E.C. District P.O.), and S. C. A. Schofield (India Office), the holder of the 22, 23, 24 and 25 miles British walking records.

A DYING SPORT?

By A. H. POPE, (INDIA OFFICE).

IT WAS ALLEGED by the usual pessimists after this year's Civil Service Road Walking Championship, which attracted the smallest entry so far received for the event, that walking in the Service was a dying sport. The C.S. Athletic Assocn., however, refuses to be discouraged and is making a big effort to revive interest in the sport by arranging representative matches against other Athletic bodies. The first of these matches will be held over a 10 miles course at Regents Park, on Saturday, 21st April, when the Metropolitan Police will provide the opposition. There is no doubt that the Police are a tough proposition, but a good Service team is being selected and Service hopes are high, although it is considered unlikely that any of our past individual champions will compete. J. H. Simpson (Trinity House), winner in 1927, is understood to be recovering from the breakdown which kept him out of this year's championship race, and A. H. Pope (India Office) this year's champion, is resting preparatory to training to defend his title in the A.A.A. Championships. C.S. Dawson (W.D.O.) winner in 1923 and 1926, and A. E. Greening (Industrial Research) winner in 1924 and 1925 seem to have retired from the sport. Twelve men will be selected to walk and eight a side will score; the Service team will probably be selected from the following:—

Messrs. C. R. Woodyard, S. C. A. Schofield, India Office; V. J. Peacock, Customs; S. L. King, I. F. Green, L. W. Davis, Air Ministry; L. F. Auger, Min. of Health; C. O. Peacock, N.D.O.; B. C. Brown, E.C.D.O.; A. E. Sime, Inland Revenue; H. W. Hunt, Ordnance Factories; A. W. Saffery, A. H. Salter, W.D.O.; W. J. Crowe, P.O.S.B.

The Police team is expected to include at least three members of the team which won the R.W.A. National 20 Miles Championship last May, and who with the Police ex-Long Distance Champion added, won the Essex R. W. Championship on March 24th.

Another event in which the C.S.A.A. is entering a team is the International Walk which is being held in Holland in the middle of July. In this event, teams of 10 men have to walk 34 miles per day for four consecutive days finishing as a team, each day, inside 11 hours.

Four teams are being sent from England, the remainder being selected, one from the Police Force, and two from the country's best long distance walkers. The selections will not be limited to racing men, and the Hon. Sec. of the C.S.A.A., Mr. G. C. Smallwood, O.B.E., 17, Manorgate Road, Kingston-on-Thames, is anxious to hear from any Civil Servant who thinks he can accomplish the feat. Competitors must be prepared to pay their own fares (about £4); accommodation and food will be provided in Holland by the promoting body.

Three in a row for Bob Dobson who produces Championship Best Time to win Civil Service '7 (Imber Court, Surrey, November 4th). This race attracted its usual very large field of approximately 90 starters and was held in ideal weather on the normal fast, flatish two lap circuit from the Metropolitan Police Sports Club at Imber Court. A field with quite a large number of top class walkers lined up at the start to contest the important team race as well as the individual one, which incorporates a match between Civil Service, Belgrave Harriers, Stock Exchange and Metropolitan Police.

Bob Dobson, the winner of the Civil Service '7' title in 1970 and 1971, exploded away to the front from the start with Amos Seddon of the Metropolitan Police chasing closely. Then came a bunch containing that remarkable Junior Champion Jacky Lord, contesting his second Senior Civil Service '7' at the age of only 17, with the ever-improving Peter Hodgkinson and Police Champion walker, Bill Sutherland, as close company. The halfway point was reached by Dobson in a sizzling 24.55 (an even-paced sub 50 minute schedule) with Amos Seddon only about 100 yards down in 25.20. Then came Jacky Lord, walking with magnificent style, in 26.34, with Peter Hodgkinson holding a comfortable fourth place in 26.50. Behind these two there was a dour battle going on between two stalwart British International walkers of recent years, Bill Sutherland and Ray Middleton, both timed at 27.00, with Middleton's Belgrave team-mate Carl Lawton, walking his usual 'strong second half race' closing rapidly.

Up front Seddon had now joined Dobson for a brief spell, until Bob Dobson sensed 'the finish' and took off to finish very strongly, making it his third Civil Service title in a row, clocking a very fast Championship record time of 50.23. His com-
